Ben Barnes is an English actor and singer. He is best known for his roles as Prince Caspian in *The Chronicles of Narnia* films, Logan Delos in *Westworld*, Billy Russo in the Marvel series *The Punisher* and The Darkling in the Netflix series *Shadow and Bone*. Other film and TV roles include *Stardust, Dorian Gray, Killing Bono, The Big Wedding, Seventh Son, Sons of Liberty, Gold Digger* and *The Institute*. Ben's released his debut album, *Where The Light Gets In*, in 2025.

Rula Lenska is a celebrated English actress with 50 years in the business. She has appeared in many British stage and television productions, and also films such as *Aura*. She portrayed Claudia Colby in the ITV soap opera, *Coronation Street*. Some of her early accolades were for *Rock Follies* in the late 1970s, a television musical drama. She has had a very varied and extensive career in television and stage, and including voice—work in audiobooks, commentaries and wildlife documentaries. She is a dedicated conservationist and has travelled far and wide.

Matt Lucas. Actor, author, comedian, presenter, and writer, Matt Lucas is perhaps best known for his work alongside David Walliams, co-creating the BBC comedy Little Britain. Matt's film credits include Alice in Wonderland, Paddington, Bridesmaids, Wonka and Gladiator II; extensive TV credits include Doctor Who, Sky Max's Fantasy Football and co-hosting The Great British Bake Off; theatre projects including Les Miserables. Additionally, Matt has created a string of bestselling children's books, including Thank You, Baked Potato and the musical novel The Boy Who Slept Through Christmas, plus his memoir Little Me.











Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat

The history of *Joseph*, by Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice, as told in the sleeve-notes to the first LP of the full work:

The history of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat is a strange one. We were asked by Alan Doggett, then Head of the Music Department at Colet Court School, to write a musical piece for his schoolboy choir to sing at the end of term concert. The first ever performance of Joseph took place on March 1st 1968 at the school and was very well received.

From there Joseph grew slowly. Using the school and makeshift orchestra we performed the work again at the Central Hall Westminster in May 1968 before an audience of about 2500 (composed largely of parents of the Colet Court boys). Joseph was only 15 minutes long in March 1968; by May it had increased to about 20 minutes. To our great surprise Derek Jewell saw the May performance and wrote a very complimentary piece in the Sunday Times. This encouraged Decca Records to make the first recording of the work of Joseph, in conjunction with the Norrie Paramor Organisation, which organisation in conjunction with the Novello & Company offered us a publishing contract. In the summer of 1968 Joseph was expanded by a further 10 minutes (bringing in such songs as 'Potiphar' for the first time) and recorded. This record was released in January 1969 and received several good reviews but did not set the commercial pop world alight. However the book published bu Novellos of the music and lyrics of Joseph (20 minutes' worth anyway) and the record were extremely successful with schools all over the country and also in America. We staged one more concert performance of Joseph ourselves with the original line-up (Martin Wilcox, David Daltrey, The Mixed Bag, Alan Doggett, Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice) at St Paul's Cathedral. It was an evening when everything went right and the show was a huge success there. By mid 1969 we felt that Joseph had gone about as far as it could and we decided to have a go at writing something else.

It was the success of that something else that resulted in the amazing continued growth of *Joseph*. Firstly the original record was released in America where it was on the charts for three months after a sales campaign that implied it was our follow up to *Jesus Christ Superstar*. But the work received its biggest boost of all when it was staged by the Young Vic Company at the 1972 Edinburgh Festival. The show was a smash in Edinburgh and went on to play at the Young Vic itself in October for two weeks. From there Joseph was transferred to the Round House where it opened on November 8th. By now it had increased in length to 40 minutes. Following the success of the limited run at the Roundhouse we were asked to expand the show again in order to make it suitable for presentation in the West End and the new material was written in America at the beginning of December 1972.

A note from the Director: "Having been in the cast of the first ever professional production of *Joseph* at The Young Vic in 1972, I have always entertained a soft spot for this marvellous little gem of a show.

Then it was a mere 25 minutes long. It has since been extended a number of times by Andrew and Tim but it still largely retains its original charm including all those beautiful original tunes and sharp, witty lyrics from 1972.

I hope you will enjoy watching the fun we have had by setting this version in 1950s mid-America as much as we have enjoyed rehearsing it."



Jeremy James Taylor OBE

While working at The Young Vic as Associate Director in 1976, Jeremy founded a youth company which grew rapidly to become today one of the world's leading youth companies: the National Youth Music Theatre – which he ran as Artistic Director for 27 years.

In the professional world he continued as a freelance director, staging works at venues including Glyndebourne, The English National Opera, The Banff Center in Canada, The National Theatre of Norway, The Snape Maltings, and many more, including Kingston's Rose Theatre.

He was awarded an OBE in 2010 for services to musical theatre and young people.

John Pearson

John was a choral scholar at Christ's College, Cambridge and then embarked on a 40-year teaching career. As an Associate Musical Director with the National Youth Music Theatre (NYMT) for 30 years, John conducted his first show, *The Roman Invasion of Rams-bottom*, at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in 1987. Many shows have followed including, amongst others, *Annie*, *Oliver*, *Tin Pan Ali*, *The Wizard of Oz*, and *The Dreaming* (by Charles Hart and Howard Goodall). John has been



MD for several different productions of *The Ragged Child*, one a nationwide tour, and another performed in Toronto and in New York. John has conducted gala concerts in several West End theatres including The London Palladium, The Piccadilly, The Adelphi and The Palace Theatre.

The NYMT also had a West End run of *Bugsy Malone* for which John was MD, re-arranging much of the music. A cast album was recorded at Abbey Road studios and is still available! The arrangements of some of the songs were published by MTI as part of their Junior Broadway series and were also used by BBC Television when John appeared with the NYMT on Blue Peter, The National Lottery Live and Children in Need. John was also the arranger and MD for a series for BBC radio called We'll Meet Again.

But probably his proudest moment was arranging and conducting the music for a large private dinner with entertainment at Windsor Castle to celebrate the 80th birthday of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

John is delighted by the reception that Thames Music Theatre has received so far, following its debut at the Rose Theatre in 2024.

Kieran Walsh

Kieran trained with the Royal Ballet and the British Ballet Organisation. He danced with the National Dance Company Wales (formerly Diversions) and has performed in *Chicago* (London) and played the role of Woof in *Hair* (Edinburgh). Kieran performed as Time with No Fit State Circus fusing dance and circus acrobatics in the original production of *Now.Here*. Kieran played the lead role of Bennett in *Another Country* by Julian Mitchell at the Old Fire Station (Oxford). Kieran has directed *I Love You, Your Perfect, Now Change, Alice in Wonderland* and *Agnes of God.* He is the principal teacher and choreographer with the England School of Dancing. Outside of theatre and dance, Kieran is a barrister in a leading London set.







Richard House

As well as designing the lighting for *The Roman Invasion of Ramsbottom* – TMT's first ever production – last year, Richard has lit a whole range of productions from English National Ballet to Rowan Atkinson and also specialises in large outdoor events such as the 60th Anniversary of VE Day at Blenheim Palace. He has worked extensively on productions for the National Youth Music Theatre including *The Ragged Child, Whistle Down the Wind, Pendragon, Captain Stirrick, Les Petits Rats, Bugsy Malone* (in the West End) nationally and internationally on Broadway and in the West End.

Richard is a Trustee of the Pleasance Theatre Trust in Edinburgh and London. He was also a Trustee of the Kingston Theatre Trust responsible for the building of The Rose Theatre – and has served on the Board of Crystal Palace Football Club.

Rob Howe

Rob studied music and musicology the University of Durham, followed by Law there. He was formerly well-involved with the National Youth Music Theatre, working as assistant MD for their production of *Bugsy Malone*, providing arrangements, musical reworkings and additional lyrics for that production, and assisting with several other of their shows and playing at charitable and gala events. He has sung and played in eminent choirs and performed with various ensembles. He works as choral conductor and parish musical director, as well as having directed music for several theatrical productions, and worked as a piano teacher, events-organiser, composer and arranger; but his day-job, for his sins, is as an IT systems developer.

Caroline Everson

Some 35 or more years ago, Caroline went to work in the office at Tiffin Boys School, in Kingston, where Jeremy was occasionally involved in drama productions. At some stage, she was asked to do a bit of sewing for the drama department and maybe help out backstage. From there things just snowballed, and Caroline found herself making costumes and suggestions until she found herself as the lead designer, maker of costumes and wardrobe mistress. Caroline worked on many productions at Tiffin, with and without Jeremy. Along the way, she has also helped the costume department of the National Youth Music Theatre, worked with Jeremy on several other productions and been responsible for some productions with Teddington Theatre Club, and somehow found herself organising costumes for a Millennium pageant for Sutton. She has worked on all the TMT shows to date.


